

#### Goal

#### **Scripture:**

John 3:16, "God loved us so much that He gave us His Son, Jesus."

#### Song:

Zacchaeus Come Down, sung to the tune of Jingle Bells

### **Activity Suggestion at Home:**

You can purpose to share something of yours with your child this week (i.e., time to read a book, perfume or cologne, etc.). Explain to your child that when you love someone you want to spend time with them and give them what you have. Jesus gave Zacchaeus love and friendship. Zacchaeus was then able to give love and friendship to others. Pray with your child and don't forget to say the words, "I forgive you" after any correction needed this week. Let your child know that you love them.
