Dear Parent,

Thank you for giving us the opportunity to teach your child. Today we learned that when Jesus went back to heaven, He gave us a promise. Jesus promised that he would ask God to send us another helper. This helper's name is the Holy Spirit. When the Holy Spirit came, those praying were all filled and spoke in another language. When others heard this different language, they wanted to learn more about God.

Goal:

Each child should know that Jesus sent us another helper, a helper that we cannot see with our eyes, but is always with us.

Scripture:

Acts 2:4, "They were all filled with the Holy Spirit."

Activity Suggestion at Home:

Talk to your child about the Holy Spirit having the ability to live inside of us, helping us to be a new person. The Holy Spirit can help us to control our temper, make proper choices, and help us to not feel lonely or afraid. Do not hesitate to pray with your child, asking the Holy Spirit to help them overcome areas that the child may be dealing with. Encourage your child to believe in his/her heart that the Holy Spirit is with us even though we cannot see Him with our eyes. Point out "evidences" of His presence such as when they hear someone praying in tongues.

Young children learn through simplicity and repetition. For this reason, we have provided you with the picture on the reverse side of this paper and the words to today's song. We encourage you to use the picture, Bible verse, and song as a daily reminder of the lesson taught today.
